



**Dr. Paulo Nobre**

Dr. Paulo Nobre is a Meteorologist, senior researcher at the National Institute for Space Research - INPE, in Brazil, where he holds a joint appointment with the Center for Weather Prediction and Climate Studies - CPTEC and the Center for Earth System Science - CCST. Got his Bachelor degree in Meteorology at the University of São Paulo (1980), MSc. at INPE (1984) and earned his Ph.D. at University of Maryland, under supervision of Prof. J. Shukla (1993). Also worked as a post-doc at Lamont-Doherty Earth Laboratory of the Columbia University with Dr. S. Zebiak (1999). Present activities include the coordination of the Coupled Ocean-Atmosphere Modeling Team at CPTEC-CCST, as well as the Climate Prediction Group at CPTEC. He also leads the development team of the Brazilian Model of the Global Climate System and presides the National Committee of the PIRATA Project in Brazil. He teaches at the Graduate Programs of Meteorology at CPTEC and Earth Sciences at CCST/INPE and is a visiting professor at the Graduate Program of Climate Sciences at the Federal University of Rio Grande do Norte, Brazil.
